Annual Ryegrass

The selection of Bounty involved trials over a wide area of annual ryegrass adaptation in the US. It was selected to have winter hardiness and yet be a good forage yielder. In several trials, it was one of the higher yielding cultivars. Bounty is a medium maturing annual ryegrass.

It will out perform gulf ryegrass in areas trialed. It has high palatability and when in a good production scheme, is highly digestible with good to excellent protein levels.

Bounty is adapted to a wide range of soil types and winter climates.

Bounty has good seed weight and is easy to spread with most fertilizer equipment or drills. It is processed to be free flowing. It will mix with fertilizer to save a trip over the pasture or field.

Bounty has the ability to root deep in Midwest soils to open up the subsoil.

Planting Rate: Drill 20 lbs per acre
 Over seed 25–30 lbs per acre
 Over seed corn, soybean,
 pasture land and for erosion
 control.
