

Brow-Tine Chicory



Brow-Tine Chicory is a broad leaf, deep rooting and drought tolerant perennial herb. Brow-Tine produces a leafy growth which is higher in nutrition and mineral content than alfalfa or cool season grasses.

Brow-Tine is low growing in the winter with broad leaves. When warm temperatures arrive in the spring it produces large number of leaves from the crown. In late spring, after it's established, flower stems begin to develop from the crown and can reach up to six feet tall if not grazed.

Brow-Tine is an excellent addition to blends including cool season legumes because of their nitrogen fixing capability. It has also been a great addition to successful wildlife herb/forb blends.

Brow-Tine Chicory is a key ingredient in many food plot blends for deer, turkeys and other wildlife.

These blends produce high protein food for deer that will increase antler development, body size, and increase whole herd health.

Seeding Suggestions:

Tilled Seedbed – Brow-Tine will do well with a moist, firm seedbed whether broadcast or drilled. If seeded in the summer, seeding should be completed before fall cooling to ensure strong stand development. Plant Brow-Tine $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ inch deep. Cultipack the seed bed before and after broadcast seeding.

Overseeding – Broadcasting and no-till drilling can be used to seed Brow-Tine into existing pastures.

Seeding Rates – When seeding alone a rate of 7 – 8 lbs. per acre is recommended.
