

Buckhorn Plantain

Forage Herb

Buckhorn plantain is a native herb to several areas of North America. It is widely adapted to several climates up to elevations of over 3500 feet.

Buckhorn plantain is recommended for livestock forage, erosion control and land reclamation.

Buckhorn plantain is a perennial that works well with grasses in a mixed pasture. It is seasonally drought tolerant similar to orchardgrass, yet will live through cold winters. It will persist in high traffic areas.

Buckhorn is good for providing high levels of calcium, cobalt, phosphorous and copper.

Buckhorn has shown some ability to reduce bloat when present in pasture blends.

It can be sown both in conventional tilled and no-tilled soils. Buckhorn will tolerate a broad range of soil types.

Buckhorn has a large root system forming into a short tap root. It is competitive to other species for productivity in lower fertility soils.

Buckhorn makes maximum yields in rotational grazing schemes.

Planting Rates:

Sole component	10 lbs. per acre
As part of a grass mix	3 - 4 lbs. per acre
