Turf Type Tall Fescue

Jubilee has been bred to maintain superior turf quality under difficult management conditions. This insures both the professional turf manager and the homeowner a tough, durable lawn.

Disease resistance is critical for long lasting turf grass. Jubilee has high resistance to rusts, leaf spots, winter blight, brown patch, mildew and other familiar ailments of tall fescue.

Jubilee leaves are medium-fine width in addition to having a soft texture, which ensures a clean, easy mowing with little shredding. Crown height has been reduced along with plant and turf height in the early spring. Leaf texture is compatible with many other cool season grasses including Kentucky bluegrass, fine fescue and perennial ryegrass.

Jubilee is bred for a uniform, rich, dark green color that is persistent even under heat, drought and cold. Jubilee provides an excellent turf for lawns, playgrounds and athletic fields, as well as roadside turf for most regions in America.
