

Purple Top Turnips



Purple top turnips are used for early fall into late winter grazing. Turnip bulbs store well in soil for later grazing.

Purple top turnips are established in mid to late summer. Turnips can be broadcast into standing corn for grazing after harvest.

Turnips and annual ryegrass make a good fall feed when broadcast into corn or soybeans before harvest.

Turnip tops and bulbs are edible. Turnips are highly digestible. Turnips are a good source of sulphur.

When being used for grazing, mixing two or more brassicas together at planting will make a longer grazing period.

Planting Rates:

Sole component: 5 lbs. per acre

As part of a grass mix: 1 – 2 lbs. per acre

- Used for early fall through late winter grazing
- Highly digestible
- Good source of sulphur
